SHERIFF JOHN SPEARS REPORTS THE FOLLOWING ONGOING ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR AND NARRATIVE EXCERPTS FROM THE WEEK ENDING March 4, 2019.

02/25 Eric McDonald, Highland, IL, was traveling eastbound on Unseth Road, town of Christiana, and became engulfed in a snowdrift. Cody Fortun, Westby, attempted to go around the McDonald vehicle, but side swiped the vehicle. No injuries were reported. The McDonald vehicle was towed due to disabling damage.
