SHERIFF JOHN SPEARS REPORTS THE FOLLOWING ONGOING ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR AND NARRATIVE EXCERPTS FROM THE WEEK ENDING March 18, 2019.

03/13 Ellen Moon, La Crosse, was traveling southbound on State Highway 35, town of Bergen. Moon missed her turn, and pulled into a wayside.
